### A: BLOCK PLAY & LITERACY LEARNING by Hudson Valley Writing Project teachers

Local Kindergarten teacher, Rebecca Burdett, and Preschool Teacher, Elaine Myrianthopoulos, will share block work from their classrooms. ### E. GIVE UP TEACHING so CHILDREN CAN TAKE UP THINKING by Pat Voytko, RDI certified consultant
